
Indianapolis Rowing Center Annual Report 2012





Message from our President

Dear IRC,

2012 has been a banner year for the Indianapolis Rowing Center. In the fall of 2011 the board offered interim executive director Jen Kaido the position of executive director, and she has led the organization ably over the past year. The board has executed its duties to provide strategic and fiduciary oversight, ensure the compliance of the organization with legal, ethical, and financial best practices, and ensure the organization has the resources and leadership to execute its mission.

Highlights from IRC board's work this past year include:

- Undertook a strategic planning process to identify priorities for the coming three years
- Reorganization our committee structure (see board organizational chart on p. #)
- Completed the phase one of the capital campaign which funded the renovation of the course and the tower.
- Continued negotiations with the city of Indianapolis to finalize a memorandum of agreement that will establish our respective responsibilities to manage the public-private partnership that has been a successful, mutually beneficial relationship for thirty years.

The board committees were instrumental in accomplishing the strategic plan's goals and objectives. Highlights include:

- The communications committee, working with the assistance of an IUPUI intern, launched a redesigned web site.
- The events committee and IRC staff hosted our second Big Ten Women's Rowing championship and worked on plans for the 2013 Big Ten championships as well as the 2013 NCAA women's rowing championship.
- The fund raising committee oversaw the annual fund campaign in the fall to support scholarships and general operating funds as well as the "Race for the Eight" boat campaign through August 2012 that, thanks to generous donors, raised money for an eight named for the Dave and Mary Ellen Carter. They also launched the "Double Up" campaign for the 2012-13 racing season (September 2102-August 2013) to raise funds to purchase two boats that can be rowed as pairs or doubles.
- The outreach committee secured a grant from the Christopher Reeves Foundation to purchase specialized equipment, and piloted an adaptive rowing program with two clinics in anticipation of the launch of a regular program in 2013. They also helped support the staff in offering our RowIndy program to IPS schools.

The board and staff, along with many dedicated members and volunteers from the community, worked diligently to help haul debris, untangle cable, and retrieve lost buoys following a spring storm that destroyed the first 1000 meters of the course just before the scheduled 2012 MACRA regatta. The incredible outpouring of volunteers who gave hundreds of hours is testimony to the dedication of IRC rowers and friends to be stewards of the remarkable facility at Eagle Creek. The board is pleased to report that in 2012 our programs thrived, our financial position remained strong, and we have the leadership to carry IRC's mission forward.

The Indianapolis Rowing Center's Mission is to develop youth and adults of all social and economic backgrounds through the sport of rowing by providing experienced and knowledgeable instruction, a variety of skill-enhancing programs, and world-class facilities.

Message from our Executive Director

As the Interim Executive Director, my main goal was to keep the organization operating as normal, offering the classes and programs that were available in years past. Once I transitioned into the ED role permanently, my goal then shifted to growing the membership (members, masters, juniors), offering classes that would reach more people in the community, developing more community relationships for outreach programs, updating the current fleet in the IRC boathouse and promoting ourselves within Indianapolis as a great venue for national events.

In 2012, we expanded the class offerings, hosted seven events, provided programming for area youth through our Junior Rowing Program in the Fall, Winter and Spring, Junior Summer Rowing, Novice Junior Summer Rowing, and RowIndy Programs within Crispus Attucks and Shortridge IPS schools, continued to offer Adult rowers the Masters Rowing Program and the Adult Rowing Program and kicked off clinics for adaptive individuals.

I love the sport of rowing and enjoy teaching it to others. My goals for the upcoming year are to promote rowing, IRC and the benefits of a healthy lifestyle to the Indianapolis community, young and old, poor or rich. I also want to promote IRC as an ideal venue for national and local events. The 2k course and Finish Tower that we are lucky enough to have, is a great site for regattas, and it needs to be showcased!



IRC Programs

YOUTH PROGRAMS

- IRC Juniors
 - Winter participants 56
 - Spring participants 70
 - Fall participants 77
- Junior Summer Rowing (June, July) 27 participants
- Novice Junior Summer Rowing (June, July) 21 participants
- RowIndy Programs at Crispus Attucks Medical Magnet High School and Shortridge Magnet High School for Law and Public Policy (January through May) – varied from 10-30 rowers each practice
- IRC youth represented 22 area schools with the top five represented schools Zionsville, Brefeuf, Park Tudor, North Central, Carmel.
- The IRC Junior Program sent two boats to the <u>USRowing Youth Nationals</u> in Oak Ridge, TN a men's pair and a women's pair
- IRC Youth continue on after high school graduation: Indiana University, Purdue University, Ball State, Ohio State, the Military, IUPUI, and Alabama.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

- Learn to Row (includes sweep rowing and sculling)
 - Three classes offered 52 total rowers (up from 23 in 2011)
- Intermediate Sculling
 - Three classes offered 16 total rowers (up from 9 in 2011)
- Adult Rowing Program 15 rowers (this program was free to members in 2011)
- Masters Rowing Program 37 rowers (up from 31 in 2011) must be IRC members
- Masters Sculling Practices typically 4-10 rowers each class (new for 2012)
- OAAR- Open and AA Masters Rowing 11 collegiate rowers (up from 5 in 2011)
- Indoor Rowing Classes over the winter
 - Cross training for cyclists, runner, swimmers (new for 2012)
 - Learn to Row for new rowers
- The IRC Masters team won the Tervis Cup in the Mixed 8+ event at the Sarasota Invitational in February. The Masters also walked away with three medals at the USRowing Masters National Championships in Worcester, MA in August.
- IRC supports member crews at Butler University, and Culver Military Academy Alumni group.


