SMALL BOAT SELECTION GUIDE

Below is a chart Club boats (1x, 2x, 2-, 4x) for members to determine which boat is best for them

First - determine the SIZE of boat you need (lightweight, midweight, heavyweight)

Open = any weight (up to 240#) Lightweight = under 155# (no Itwt boats at this time) Midweight = 155-185# Heavyweight = over 185#

Second - determine your SKILL LEVEL (Beginner, Novice, Intermediate, Competition)

Beginner = learn to scull/row Novice = sculling one year or less Intermediate = sculling 1+ years Competition = goal is to race a small boat

*NOTE - you can row a skill level DOWN, but you cannot row a skill level UP if you are not ready
