**Approved meeting minutes from March 13, 2023

Financials

Cash position has improved. Major expenses noted were: Replaced stolen section of the start docks (\$9,880) and 25% deposit paid on the concrete pad for the launch dock (\$7,298)

Executive Director report (attached)

Fund Raising is still yellow in the dash board, as it needs planning, definition, and progress.

Masters wonder if we could offer a "punch card" system for those who want to row but cannot attend regularly. We would like to know how other clubs manage this type of payment and administrate it.

Summer Camp counsellors will be W-2 employees, this year. Must be 16 yr 3 mo old and have a driver's license.

Fleet: A heavy-weight FOUR and singles have been determined to be the priority needs. We are talking with Pocock & Vespoli about proposals.

Launch Motors: We believe the current problems are caused by sediment in the lake (we have not seen this engine problem in the past) Willie and Danny plan to buy parts after the 2023 season and replace some parts in the older motors. New engine purchases are not in the near future.

Concrete Pad for launch dock: Delayed by the requirement to obtain a drainage study by a professional engineer (at an additional cost of \$1200).

Contractor expects construction to require one week. An additional week is needed for the concrete to cure.

Recent regattas:

We expect to clear approximately \$6,000 profit from hosting the MACRA regatta.

We also think we might profit \$8,000 from the HS Sprints (numbers not available, yet).

Big Ten Championships are next weekend.

Indy Summer Sprints are June 17

New launch drivers would like more training and practice. It was suggested that we offer "ride-along" experience during a regatta and perhaps more opportunities to practice by driving coaches during rowing practice.

Launch Docks

We can start "phase one" of the new launch docks with ONE finger (and a spur for the coaching launches) at a cost of \$141,000. This plan would have two fingers of the dock remain as bubble docks. The dock manufacturer will let us deposit 50% and make payments

**Voted to move ahead with the proposed phase one and \$70K deposit with the knowledge that we are committing to raising the other \$70,000.

MANAGEMENT/OPERATIONS

Staffing:

- Middle school program looking to add additional coach for Fall 2023 to accommodate growing enrollment.
- Positions for summer camp counselor positions have been posted. Summer camp counselors will be W-2 employees.

Equipment

- The evaluation of our current fleet has been completed and needs have been identified. A heavyweight four and singles have been identified as the highest priority. As a result, we purchased the Stoll single and it is now a club boat. Staff is currently working with Pocock & Vespoli to put together another fleet replacement proposal. Additional equipment was purchased for the adaptive program.
- Launch motors have been having issues with sediment from lake water causing problems. Willie is working through a possible solution to help the motors clear this debris. Current motors will get us through the 2023 season.

Dock Replacement Project Update; Location improvement permit was submitted on April 16th to the Bureau of Neighborhood Services. They have come back to us and said that we need to apply for a drainage permit and have requested a drainage study. IRC will incur an additional \$1,200 for the engineer to complete the study. The anticipate delay is approximately six weeks. We are still hopeful that installation will happen prior to Master's Nationals. We will need to have a contingency plan for our summer camp if installation happens during one of the summer camp weeks. Due to funding, we are recommending a phased implementation of the dock

EVENTS

 MACRA Regatta: 18 Clubs with just over 500 athletes. Regatta made a profit of approximately \$6,000. All indications are that they would like to return next year, but not confirmed.



Indianapolis Rowing Center Executive Director Summary May 2023

- Indy Jr sprints: 14 clubs with 202 entries. The final numbers are not yet available, but we anticipate it being at or above MACRAs. We need to evaluate the communication of results to event participants. Here Now is cost-prohibitive, but we are looking at what else can be used to communicate the results of the race.
- Big Ten Women's Rowing Championships May 13 14, 2023
- Indy Summer Sprints June 17, 2023
- USRowing Masters Nationals: budget submitted, waiting on a response. Planning is underway with bi-weekly meetings with USRowing.

PROGRAMS

Program Enrollment:

- Masters: 48
- LTR: 41 registered May & June classes are full
- Enrollment for summer camps is underway we are offering 6 weeks of camp.
 34 registrations over the course of 6 weeks.
- The adaptive program started practices on 5/4/2023 with 7 participants
- Met with IRC individuals interested in helping to start up a Stem to Stern program at IRC. The target age group for this program is middle school and would target underserved communities.

 The grant request for the dock replacement project submitted to The Lilly Endowment was turned down. Currently looking for individuals for the fundraising committee to help with grants and fundraising.



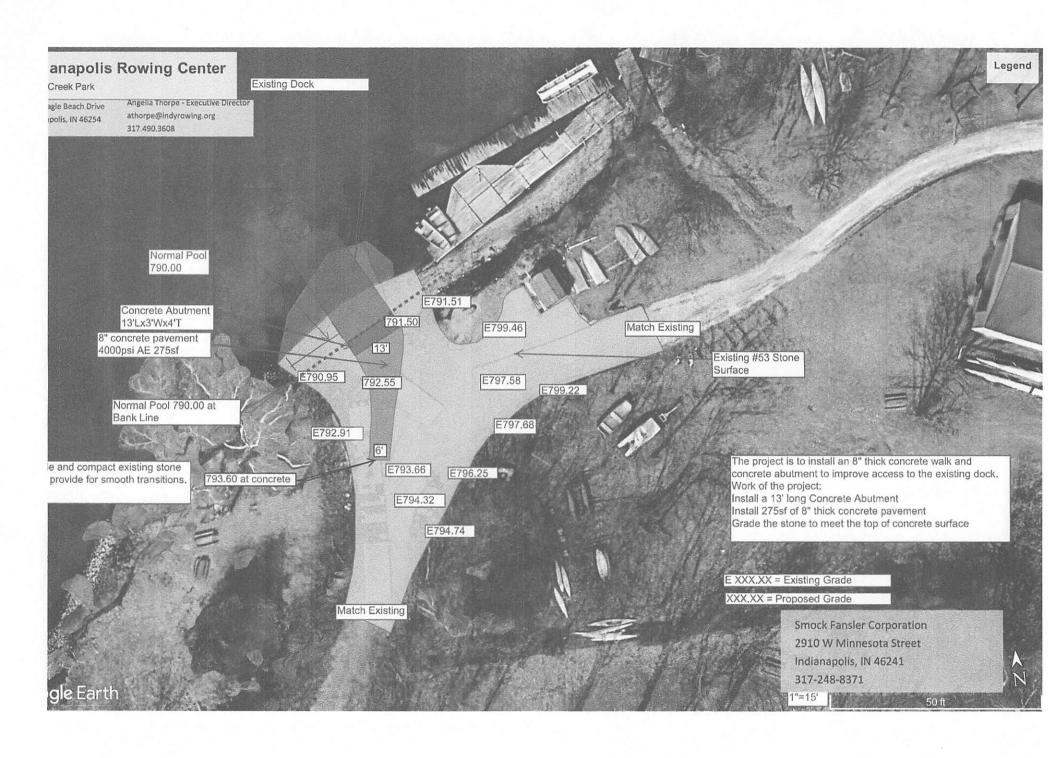

IRC Board Recommendation - Dock Replacement

May 8, 2023

Version 2- UPDATED

As you may recall, in the fall of 2022, IRC embarked on the first step towards upgrading our dock infrastructure by raising over \$30,000 to cover the cost of an ADA compliant cement platform through your generous donations. A concrete company has developed a design, and we are resubmitting the necessary permits. Once we get the approvals, we will be able to start the work on building our new platform, weather permitting. Targeting end of June 2023. We have put down a deposit and still owe \$22,000 on the concrete pad.

Next is replacing our 40+ year old, outdated, aging docks with state of the art, durable and steady docks from EZ Dock. EZ Dock is willing to allow IRC to structure a payment plan, just as we did for Pocock.

Recommendation: Move forward with signing an agreement with EZ Dock for the main gangway, coaches launch dock and one dock 'finger' now and set up a payment plan. Details are outlined below:

- Main Gangway \$69,296
- Dock one dock 'finger' \$50,341
- Coaches launch dock \$21,882
- Total amount \$141,519
- Put down a 50% deposit of \$70,759.50. Recommended payment schedule:
 - o October 2023 \$11,793.25
 - o January 2024 \$11,793.25
 - o April 2024 \$11,793.25
 - o July 2024 \$11,793.25
 - o October 2024 \$11,793.25
 - o January 2025 \$11,793.25

We will also kick off a capital campaign to raise money for the docks and pay this commitment off sooner if we are able to secure funding. The remaining two fingers will be targeted for 2025 and are each \$50,341 for a

total of \$100,682. If we want to purchase new retrieval docks it will be an additional \$77,200.

We were able to secure several significant regattas and clinics in 2023 and are anticipating 4,000+ athletes, 1,500+ spectators and over \$2.5 million in economic impact as a result. The regattas and clinics include:

- Mid-Atlantic Collegiate Rowing Association (MACRA) April Already held
- Women's Big 10 Rowing Championships May
- Indianapolis Junior Sprints (Youth) May
- Indy Summer Sprints (Adult) June
- US Rowing Masters Nationals (Adult) July
- Bald Eagle (collegiate regatta coordinated through Purdue University) -November
- Various clinics including; Adaptive, Veterans, Big Brother Big Sister,
 Wabash various times
- College, Indy SurvivOars, and a new clinic for 2023 for the Traumatic Brain Injury – various times
- Survivors of Indiana/Heads or Tails

Purchasing state of the art, ADA compliant launch and retrieval docks will create a superior venue – bringing our course infrastructure on par or better than other elite rowing venues nationally. Upgrading our docks also will position IRC to be competitive in securing future national events i.e.; NCAA's, Big 10's, MACRA's, Intercollegiate Rowing Association (IRA), other USRowing National Regattas, as well as growing our local programs for the wider community. Our local programs bring in over 600 individuals annually.
